Choosing a Confirmation Name And Written Report

A main part of the Sacrament of Confirmation is taking on the name of a Saint. Remember, you are to choose a *person* that has meaning to you, and not just a name. The Parish Priest will be discussing your choice with you, and will determine if it is appropriate. If the Bishop does not find your name acceptable, he will change it on the day of confirmation. Therefore, be sure you have good reasons for choosing your saint name.

You will need to research Catholic Saints and submit a <u>two to three paragraph report</u> on the life of the saint you choose. Please be specific in your report. Include an informal bibliography of your sources of information. The Confirmation directors and the CRE have examples from previous years if you need assistance.

Your report must include:

- When and where did he/she live?
- How did they live out their faith?
- Why did you choose this saint?
- How will this particular saint affect your life?
- How will you incorporate the virtues of the saint into your own life?

To help you get started, try searching Catholic Saints or Catholic Patron Saint of (<u>something</u> <u>significant to you</u>)
